Time and Location:

Times: 6 hours per week at an assigned clinic placement. Placement maybe on or off campus

Expanded Course Description:

This experiential education course is designed for students who are in their second year in the Athletic Therapy Certificate program. Students will be assigned to a clinical setting for six hours per week for two terms. The clinical placements will either involve one full year in one clinical setting or two different clinical experiences. Placements will be provided with students engaged both on and off campus. Students will be involved in a hands-on experience involving clinic health record management, clinical assessments and treatment provision. They will work under the direction of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III to gain clinical knowledge and skills.

Organization of the Course:

This course includes students being assigned to a clinical placement by the course instructor. Students will be required to establish clinical goals using a learning contract template as well as complete assignments throughout the year. Students will practice assessments and treatments under supervision.

Course Learning Outcomes:

Through the opportunities provided by this course, second year Athletic Therapy students will have demonstrated the ability to:

- Practice basic assessments of the whole body under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists, Sport Physiotherapists II or III.
- Practice advanced treatments under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III.
- Practice rehabilitation design under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III.
- Adhere to government guidelines for health care documents and privacy guidelines for patients.

Grading:

A grade of A,B,C,D, F will be assigned at the end of the term. Students who receive a grade of D or F will be required to repeat an additional 30 clinical hours.

Students with a documented reason for missing an assignment such as illness, compassionate grounds etc., which is confirmed by documentation (e.g., a physician's letter) will be allowed to hand in those assignments on a later date set by the course instructor.
