### Time and Location:

Times: 10 hours per week at an assigned clinic placement. Placement maybe on or off campus

### Expanded Course Description:

This course is designed for students who are in their third year in the Athletic Therapy Certificate stream. Students will be assigned to a clinical setting for ten (10) hours per week for two terms. The clinical placements will either involve one full year in one clinical setting or two different clinical experiences. Placements will be provided both on and off campus. Students will be involved in a hands-on experience involving clinic health record management, advanced clinical assessments and treatment provision. They will work under the direction of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III to gain clinical knowledge and skills.

### Organization of the Course:

This course includes students being assigned to a clinical placement by the course instructor. Students will be required to establish clinical goals using a learning contract template as well as complete assignments throughout the year. Students will practice assessments and treatments under supervision.

Through the opportunities provided by this course, third year Athletic Therapy students will have demonstrated the ability to:

Practice advanced assessments under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists, Sport Physiotherapists II or III.

Practice advanced treatments under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III.

Practice complete rehabilitation programs under the guidance of Certified Athletic Therapists or Sport Physiotherapists II or III.

Recognize the referral processes used in sports medicine.
